The Apostle Paul had many adventures during his life whilst he travelled by land and water to spread the teachings of Jesus. Often he was in danger because people were against him or because of wild weather.

In the last chapters of the Book of Acts in the New Testament, one of Paul's companions, called Luke, tells vivid stories about what happened when Paul's friends were taken from Jerusalem to Rome by boat across the Mediterranean Sea. Throughout the journey there was uncertainty and danger alongside the promise of safety.

No one exactly knows what finally happened to Paul. It is thought Paul spent some time in prison and he did write from Rome, more of his letters to new Christian communities around the Mediterranean.
