Paul's Journeys and Letters



In the time after Pentecost many messengers, often called apostles, set out to carry the teachings of Jesus far afield. Jesus' disciples, became apostles but so did others.

A man named Paul, whose original name was Saul, became an apostle. Saul hated followers of Jesus and tried to kill them, but he had a dramatic encounter on the road to Damascus and changed his mind and changed his name! When Saul became Paul, he became one of the best known apostles for spreading the word about Jesus and how you should lead your life the way that Jesus had taught.



In the first video you will see a great many of the places that Paul travelled to speaking about Jesus. The little red plane takes you on the journeys over the places in and around the Mediterranean Sea. His journeys were mostly on land but there were short and long sea trips too. During and after his travels, Paul wrote many letters to different places and people that he had visited or heard about. Sometimes he wrote to places he had visited, or to answer a question from a letter someone had written to him. On occasions he wrote a letter to a place he had not been to but hoped to visit and so he wrote a letter to arrive before him. Paul always greeted the people he was writing to and if he was not known there, introduced himself.

The letters were personally taken by fiends and travellers to the distant parts around the Mediterranean as there was no postal service. https://m.youtube.com/watch?v=s1mBdzjMEDk


