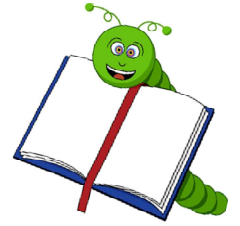

Thousands of years ago people told different stories round their fires and then eventually wrote them down. Some of these stories were about the creation of the world. The story below is written in the Old Testament part of the Bible and is at the beginning of the very first book called Genesis - the word means "beginning". The story can be found in the whole of Genesis chapter 1 and the start of chapter 2 until verse 4. It is also in the Spark Story Bible in the chapter Creation.

Genesis is a book of beginnings, because it talks about the beginnings of the universe, the beginning of human beings and the beginnings of many generations of God's people.

See if you can work out the right day when the answer to the riddles arrived on earth in the Creation Story.

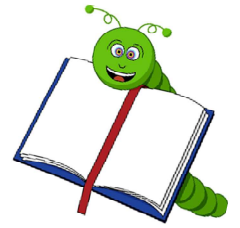


Season of Creationtide

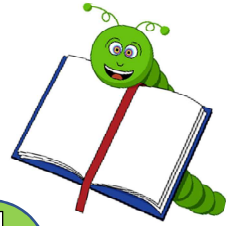
